## Purchasing a Special Fed Market Veal What to Know as a Buyer

At the time of the sale, a special fed market veal will weigh between 150 and 450 pounds with an average weight of 409 pounds.

Special fed market veal sell for between $\$ 2.50$ and $\$ 4.00$ a pound with an average price of $\$ 3.30$ per pound.
Processing fees (butchering, cutting, and wrapping) vary based on the butcher. The estimated processing total is $\$ 480$. For a precise amount, contact one of the suggested butchers.

After butchering and processing, special fed market veal yield about $40 \%$ (+/-10\%) meat. If the average special fed market veal weighs 409 pounds, the yield will be about 158 pounds of meat.

158 pounds of meat will need about 3 to 4 cubic feet of freezer space.

Below is a summary of what to expect when buying a special fed market veal at the Ramona Junior Fair. (Please note, this information is an estimate and actual numbers may vary.)

A 409 pound special fed market veal calf is purchased at the price of $\$ 3.30$ per pound for a total of $\$ 1350$. After the butcher's processing fee of $\$ 479$, the total is $\$ 1828$. By dividing $\$ 1828$ by the weight of the meat taken home ( 158 pounds) the price of $\$ 11.56$ is paid per pound for this high-quality, hand-raised meat. In the process, you have helped a young person complete their project, reach a hard-earned goal, and possibly make a profit to help fund future projects. Also, because you are buying through the Ramona Junior Fair (a 501 c3 non-profit), you can consult with your tax preparer and possibly receive a tax write-off for any amount that you paid that is over the current market price. It's a win-win situation for both parties!

## What Does an Exhibitor Put in to Raising a Special Fed Market Veal?

The animal receives 4 months of hand feeding, exercise, and care.
One special fed market veal is purchased for $\$ 350$ to $\$ 400$.

The cost of feed to finish a special fed market veal (Milk \& Grain) is $\$ 600$ to $\$ 800$.
The total estimated investment into raising the special fed market veal calf is $\$ 950$ to $\$ 1200$.

With a conservative average financial investment of $\$ 1075$ into a special fed market veal at an average weight of 409 pounds, the average breakeven point for the kids, when selling through the auction, is $\$ 2.62$ per pound.
